

Very disappointed. While I like to see photos of the history I am reading about, I want a little more written info. The entire book is basically, here is a photo of someone from ..., (lots of those photos), or here they are getting an eye exam, or here is a motley crew sitting around. No photo has more than a couple of paragraphs of info.

I was a bit disappointed. The information was good, however presented in a dry format. If the writer had followed some of the people from arrival to their new residence giving the reader a feel of knowing the person. I personally would have enjoyed the book much more if the presentation were different.. If I had wanted a dry documentry I would have taken a class on the subject.

For a historian/genealogist this book should be considered for information about Ellis Island . It also could be a good reference where to lead someone to dwell more in depth into Ellis Island in finding family/friends who traveled through Ellis Island and the ordeal they had to endure.

This book is a good way to start learning the history of Ellis Island. I enjoyed seeing the pictures and reading the commentary. I would have liked more discussion of its history.
