

I highly recommend this book for menswear patternmaking. It is very complete, with sections and patterns for all the major casual wear types, including denim jackets, jeans, and t-shirts. If you want to make your own clothes, this book and a good sewing reference (The Sewing Book) will get you there.

As it is, the patterns are for very basic men's wear. Still a very useful reference book.

Not a complete book on tailoring but better than many other books on the topic. There are a number of helpful parts but more of a production book rather than designing a fashion garment. Worth owning to produce standard patterns.

I am a tailor and I purchased this book to train my new employees on the basics of suit pattern making. It is great literature for them to take home and continually study. I would recommend this to anyone wanting to learn to make a suit, slacks or shirts.
