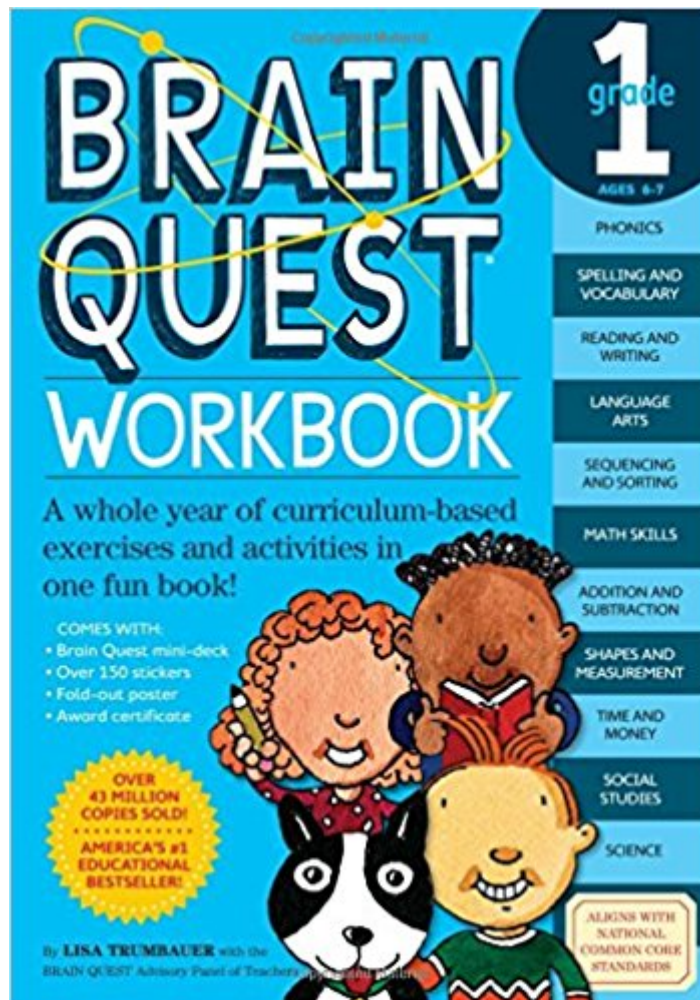


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# Brain Quest Workbook: Grade 1

Used this as part of a homeschool-esque curriculum for my 4 year old son before entering Kindergarten. Extra large, full color pages. Lots of great information, challenging worksheets, and fun, simple images.

I bought this workbook for my daughter to use during the summer between her kindergarten and first grade years. She already knew how to do most things in the book, but it was challenging enough that she was getting practice. The activities went hand in hand with the things and methods she was learning in school. I will probably continue to get the books for each grade during the summers. I would highly recommend this for families who feel their child needs a little extra support in their current learning, or for keeping them on track during breaks.

My daughter really liked this book. It is great for summer homework or breaks so that they do not forget what they are learning. I am extremely happy with this book.

I bought this book to help keep my boyfriend's young daughter in the habit of school work on her summer vacation between kindergarten and first grade. At first when I told her she was going to do some work when she came over she was resistant to the idea. But once she saw the book, she immediately opened it, picked a page and started working. For her, it looks fun, unlike the xeroxed copies she got at school, these pages are in full color. It seems more like a fun activity book or game to her than "schoolwork." The pictures are cute, there are lots of animals and fun scenes, sometime I see her going through the book just to look at the pictures. Like I said I bought this book to keep her in the habit of working and thinking, and this book does the trick. Much of the book is phonics and letters, which were much too easy for her, but this didn't really bother me. In fact it encouraged her because she was able to complete whole pages without having to ask for help. Now that we're getting to the part where she writes sentences, I feel it is more at her level. There is also math stuff, which they present in such a way that it seems like you're playing games. There is also a science section, one page has the child color everything in the picture that is a plant green. The concepts are easy to understand and are fun. Some of the activities she is able to complete on her own, but needs more of an explanation from me. For example, the which monster is taller exercise required me to explain to her how we use rulers to measure different things in different ways. But that's all part of teaching, you can't expect a single book to teach everything without any guidance from you! In the back of the book, there are answers, stickers and a certificate of completion. She's already looking forward to getting the grade 2 version of the book!

LOVE THIS! Just WISH there were more pages of the same thing for practice. Or a CD of those pages to print more, for more practice. Normally 1-2 page per lesson. Would like 10 pages per lesson. Easy to read, very good for kids to figure out what to do. I have not found a better one!

This book is absolutely amazing. I got it and as soon as my six-year-old son saw the book he was interested. He wanted to do the work. It is easy for him to read by himself. He does his work and feels proud. I pick out a couple of pages from a couple of subjects so he doesn't get overwhelmed. He loves his book and does his work every time he has free time. There is an answer key in the back of the book along with stickers. The pages are easy tear so that is a plus.

These Brain Quest workbooks are awesome! I totally recommend them. My kids love them.

I love these books. The first and second grade books are more of just a review for the first grade except for the introduction of multiplication and division in the second grade book. These are very colorful, easy to follow, include answer keys, stickers and have educational posters in them.
