

Melanie Benjamin on The Aviator's Wife What was I thinking, writing a novel about Anne Morrow Lindbergh? That is a question I asked myself every time I sat down to work on The Aviator's Wife. For Anne Morrow Lindbergh guarded her privacy fiercely and, at times, I felt she was eluding me just to make that point! My other heroines—Alice Liddell in Alice I Have Been and Lavinia Warren Stratton in The Autobiography of Mrs. Tom Thumb—gave up their secrets easily, almost eagerly. Anne, however, did not. But that was what attracted me to her story in the first place—because of how elusive Anne remains to this day. She is known in fragments but never completely. Some are aware of her child's horrific kidnapping and murder. Others remember her chiefly as the shy, pretty bride of the most heroic man of his time. Many women revere her as an early feminist writer. But few know her entire story, including her major accomplishments as an aviator in her own right, her grit and determination, her inner strength. Always she seems willing to stand in the tall shadow of her husband, Charles Lindbergh. And it was her marriage that fascinated and obsessed me; this marriage between two extraordinary and very different individuals under the relentless glare of the spotlight. This operatic life they led, through dizzying heights of accomplishment and celebrity to the devastating lows of what Anne always saw as the price they paid for flying too close to the sun. It seemed to me, as I studied her, standing always slightly behind her husband, that there was a sly smile, a gleam in her eyes that she was always suppressing; a secret strength hidden from the world and even, at times, herself. This was the Anne Morrow Lindbergh whose story I wanted to tell. It's time for Anne to step out from behind her husband's shadow once and for all and be the heroine in her own epic story.

In this outing, she spotlights Anne Morrow Lindbergh, wife of wildly famous Charles Lindbergh and pioneering aviatrix and accomplished author in her own right. Though their courtship is the stuff of every girl's romantic fantasy, time and reality combine to reveal a much different story. Plagued by tragedy and often stifled by her domineering husband, she eventually manages to carve out a quasi-independent life and career for herself. If you told me this was an unearthed autobiography, I would have believed you. The writing is so like Anne Morrow Lindbergh's that it could pass for fact, but it is fiction. I am of an age where I received her book, "Gift from the Sea" as a graduation present. But for those of you who are younger, this is a magnificent book on marriage and the compromises some spouses make -- while the other runs the show. Charles Lindbergh's family was, during the 30's and 40's, THE most famous family in the nation. The publicity about them was overwhelming, excruciating, yet Lindbergh himself felt he was somehow worthy of it. He was an odd duck, rigid, demanding, but charismatic. She drank the Kool-Aid ... at the beginning. Then, as the multiple children came along, she realized at some level, she was in over her head. I encourage young women to read this book before they marry. Why? Marriage is never what we think it is going to be. This shows you an extreme example of what can, and does, happen in marriages, especially high-profile ones. It is a cautionary tale that reinforces the Japanese saying, "Know your love through all the seasons." There are no do-over's in life, and one comes to the end of the book with a sigh, a welter of emotions. p.s. One of the first policemen to respond to the call about "the baby", believed to the end of his life that Charles Lindbergh had played a prank on his wife that went terribly awry. The ransom note was someone taking advantage of the situation. This, however, is not in the book.

I loved the book. It was well written and the descriptions of the characters was very complete. It is a shame that Lindbergh who acted like an adolescent in his flying across the ocean and never came out of it. I was pleased that Anne finally became a full fledged success between her family, her

It is hard to imagine how descriptive the author is in this book could have been in capturing the emotions and characters of the the protagonist and Lindberg himself in this very touching book. It is captivating from the beginning and much more readable than a history book. But a history book it is indeed. I learned more about this woman and her "superhero" husband and the evolution of air travel than I ever could have in a history book.

Charles Lindbergh was always referred to as "Lucy Lindy." And indeed he was lucky to have had such an amazing partner and wife. Anne's heartbreak story of their marriage and her own growth as an accomplished woman in her own rights is a wonderful story well told by Ms. Benjamin. A great read for older women looking back on the trials of their own journeys as well as for young women just beginning theirs.

First off I must say, I am a huge fan of Anne Morrow Lindbergh and have read all that she has written..and all that has been written about her. I never knew how much I could hate Charles Lindbergh and it was hard to deal with Anne sometimes. I know it was a different time and we tend to look at things through a modern lens, but it was hard for me to deal with a character that just swoons every time she looks at a guy who is verbally abusive and neglectful. I am glad she finally found her strength but overall I would not read this book again just because of the characters and their personality traits.
