

The facts of the cases are edited to the point that you can't even understand the background. Many crucial details, including the exact details of the challenged statute in question, are missing because the facts are so condensed. The font is terrible. Hard to read. The authors make so many edits to the Supreme Court opinions that you get lost at whose words you're actually reading. There are so many unnecessary footnotes inserted into the cases, footnotes like "for a review, see X" or "see also X." These do nothing but detract from the opinion.

This book abridges cases to the point where there are little to no facts, so you are basically supposed to do extra research if you want to understand the holding. Furthermore, the authors who compiled this book cite to their own law review articles constantly throughout the book. I had the Chemerinsky book for the first section of my con law class and it was far superior. I didn't know, until I had to use this book, how terrible a casebook could be. If you can avoid using this book, I highly suggest it.

This casebook really tries, but there are several flaws that make it awful:1) It is HUGE. I wish it had been put into two volumes, because carrying it around is unpleasant.2) The margins are tiny. I like to take notes in the margins, and it is virtually impossible with this book.3) The cases are poorly edited - the authors must really want to be on the Supreme Court because they end up rewriting a significant portion of each case.
