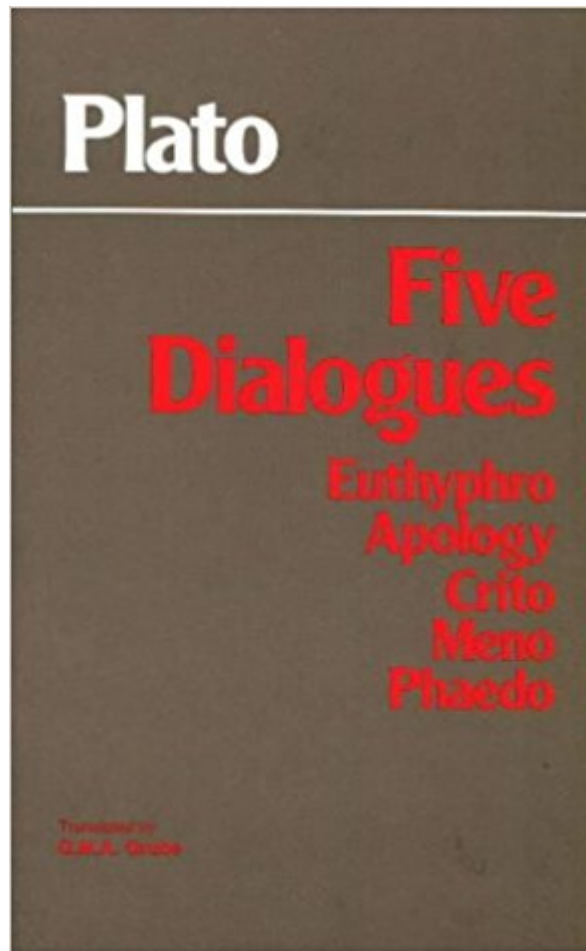




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Plato - Five Dialogues: Euthyphro, Apology, Crito, Meno, Phaedo
