

Denial: Holocaust History On Trial



Synopsis

In her acclaimed 1993 book *Denying the Holocaust*, Deborah Lipstadt called David Irving, a prolific writer of books on World War II, “one of the most dangerous spokespersons for Holocaust denial.” The following year, after Lipstadt’s book was published in the United Kingdom, Irving filed a libel suit against Lipstadt and her publisher. She prepared her defense with the help of a first-rate team of solicitors, historians, and experts, and a dramatic trial unfolded. *Denial*, previously published as *History on Trial*, is Lipstadt’s riveting, blow-by-blow account of this singular legal battle, which resulted in a formal denunciation of a Holocaust denier that crippled the movement for years to come. Lipstadt’s victory was proclaimed on the front page of major news-papers around the world, such as *The Times* (UK), which declared that “history has had its day in court and scored a crushing victory.”

I was familiar with the legal cases that were at the heart of this book and the related film, and having taught and written about law and literature, and the role of story in explaining legal issues,whether in text or film or other media, I was anxious to see this film, and ordered this book on which it was based for my kindle to read before the film came to our theater. I would have liked to see more detail on the legal issues that were used to undermine the holocaust denier in the film, but obviously this book could cover more ground and the film was more focused. I recommend reading the book and then seeing the film, or renting it. It is something appropriate for library or community or religious group presentations/discussions. It feeds into the broader issue of 'alt-reality' whether in climate change denial, or misrepresentation of any political/economic/factual dispute in current public discourse. I would have liked to have seen a little more context in this book and the film based on it to show how the issues it raises are pervasive in our society in many ways today. Read it and weep.
