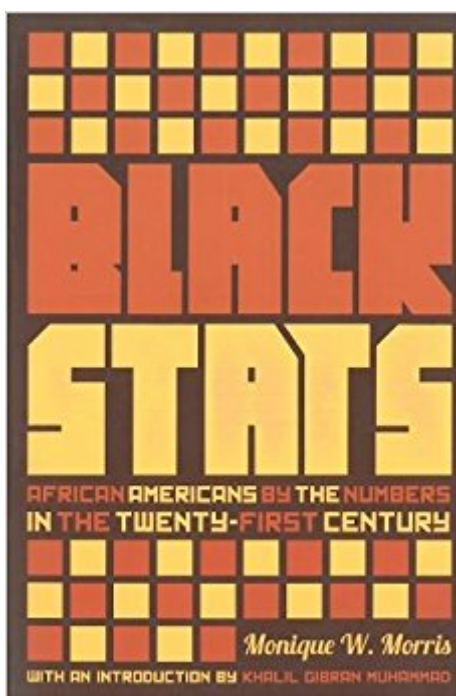

Synopsis

Black Stats is a comprehensive guide filled with contemporary facts and figures on African Americans; is an essential reference for anyone attempting to fathom the complex state of our nation. With fascinating and often surprising information on everything from incarceration rates, lending practices, and the arts to marriage, voting habits, and green jobs, the contextualized material in this book will better attune readers to telling trends while challenging commonly held, yet often misguided, perceptions. A compilation that at once highlights measures of incredible progress and enumerates the disparate impacts of social policies and practices, this book is a critical tool for advocates, educators, and policy makers. Black Stats offers indispensable information that is sure to enlighten discussions and provoke debates about the quality of Black life in the United States today; and help chart the path to a better future. There are less than a quarter-million Black public school teachers in the U.S. — representing just 7 percent of all teachers in public schools. Approximately half of the Black population in the United States lives in neighborhoods that have no White residents. In the five years before the Great Recession, the number of Black-owned businesses in the United States increased by 61 percent. A 2010 study found that 41 percent of Black youth feel that rap music videos should be more political. There are no Black owners or presidents of an NFL franchise team. 78 percent of Black Americans live within 30 miles of a coal-fired power plant, compared with 56 percent of White Americans.

W. E. B. DuBois famously stated that “the problem of the twentieth century is the problem of the color-line,” and this slim volume tracks twenty-first-century data along that line. This statistical snapshot of black Americans examines how bias is affected (and, surprisingly, not affected) by demographics and numbers. Chapters include “Education,” “Entertainment and Sports,” “Health,” “Justice,” and “Politics, Voting, and Civic Engagement.” Each set of statistics is framed by a question (for example, “What is the percentage of Black teachers, and where do they teach?” and “How many black people are employed in the science, technology, and engineering sectors?”). Two appendixes look specifically at black females and black males, and there are extensive notes for each chapter. This thought-provoking, browsable book is recommended for libraries of all types. --Rebecca Vnuk
