This book is gold! But you definitely need to have some basic knowledge of how the LSAT works before you begin on this book. It is a little difficult at some places and there are not as many practice problems as I hoped there would be. Overall, a great quality product written by a knowledgeable author.

Blueprint was by far my favorite LSAT prep. Video explanations for this book are great. Strategies are clear and easy to apply. Presentation of the material is about as interesting as you can make it. I made huge improvements on my speed on the logic games section of the LSAT. I went from finishing about 2 games to finishing the entire section. Definitely recommend.

I got the Kindle version and the book itself is really helpful! Blueprint is great about making the LSAT

user friendly and surprisingly fun - I like the characters it uses like the Ninja or Cleetus, and their explanations are easy to follow. However, the book is hard to navigate on the Kindle as you can't skip around as easily or write directly on the games. Also for someone already taking the BluePrint LSAT course, it was fairly repetitive. I thought there would be more examples of each game type to try on my own, but it's mostly lessons and walk throughs. Definitely a great way to go if you're just starting out learning logic games! Less useful if you're just looking for extra practice.

So I'm currently in a BP class for LSAT prep, and for the most part the games lessons we get are pretty great on their own. With this book, the semi-arduous process of learning game types, game strategies, diagramming tips, and practice in seeing deductions gets a lot more manageable. They really break down the process for you in a great, easy-to-read format and IMO much more approachable as a method that you can internalize versus other books I've used already. Long story short, if you want to get a leg up on games, this book is a must.

Taking a Blueprint course concurrently, this book supplements the strategies taught in the class and provides additional practice. It has helped me improve in logic games and as always includes the humor typically associated with Blueprint, which makes it enjoyable to read. I highly recommend this book to anyone preparing to take the LSAT and particularly those needing extra practice in logic games.

The format was easy to read and encouraging; yet not condescending. I am attempting a second retry on the LSAT as my score was low due to a poor logic games section. I am trying a self study method this time around and the interest of full disclosure; so here I was offered a free copy of the Kindle book in exchange for my review.

I've had intro classes with many other LSAT programs and I can say Blueprint has instructors that are helpful and use techniques that are easy to follow. The same goes for this book it is direct and uses real LSAT questions which is important when studying for the LSAT. It is important to have a good breakdown of how to answer logic questions and this book assists you with this. Overall very helpful. Would recommend as a book to use because it helps make studying much easy.
