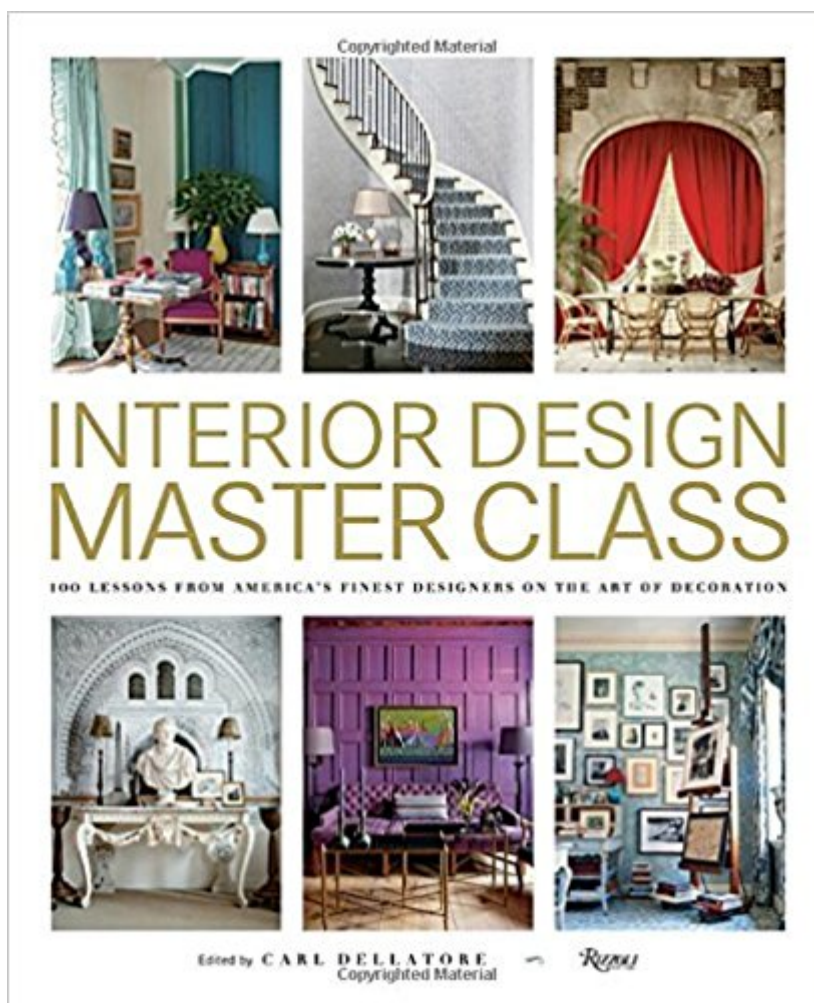


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Interior Design Master Class: 100 Lessons From America's Finest Designers On The Art Of Decoration

This is a good book about a wide ranging subject. As an architect, you appreciate that there is a great deal of complexity and wide range of paths to take in order to meet Vitruvius' emblematic statement about great architecture being the attainment of "firmness, commodity and delight." Well interior design as a sub-set of architecture is really about the latter two, but on a more personal and tangible level, as interior design is what you a big part of what you actually live with. This book attempts to cover some of the paths you may take in order to achieve "delight", but probably not a lot about "commodity". Ultimately, it is a good attempt to cover a wide ranging topic, but is not really for the uninitiated, but rather for the student of design, as it is really a series of essays about particular elements to consider in good design.

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
