Synopsis

Britt Arthur's life is forever changed when the wizard Merlin summons her back through time to pose as the legendary King Arthur. Or she was, until Lancelot shows up. Britt is forced by Merlin to welcome the young knight into her courts, and life goes downhill from there. King Leodegrance, a close ally who also happens to have the Round Table, which Britt dearly wants, is attacked by the foul Duke Maleagent. Unwilling to abandon her ally and let the Round Table slip through her fingers, Britt rides with a party of knights to Leodegrance's lands in hopes of providing help. Unfortunately the Round Table proves to be less than impressive, King Leodegrance is not the man Britt thought him to be, and, worst of all, Guinevere has set her romantic ambitions on Britt's King Arthur persona. Leodegrance needs a champion to fight Maleagant or he will be ruined, but does Britt really need to do battle on behalf of a greedy man and his daughter whom Britt knows will bring ruin to Arthur and Camelot? There was never a King like this one! King Arthur is really Britt Arthurs, an American tourist who came to Britain with her friends. When she touches the famed Sword in the Stone, she's immediately transported to King Arthur's time. Since the real Arthur ran off with a shepherdess, Merlin (who's young, and hot), devised a plan with fairy magic, to bring a person that the sword deemed worthy to take Arthur's place as king. In book two, we see a great number of knights pledge their loyalty to Britt (as King Arthur), as she plans to change the world, bringing honor, chivalry, and peace. In book three, we meet Lancelot, who Britt hates intensely (because she knows that he steals Guinevere from King Arthur and causes the downfall of Camelot), and Guinevere, a simpering spoiled girl.

I've only read two books by this author so far, Beauty and the Beast and MBRC, and like those two books I loved these books. I think what I like about these books so much is that all the heroin's have

a good sense of humor about the absolutely absurd situations they're in. Break a leg falling through a skylight in the home of a man turned beast and his cursed household? Ah, the leg will heal, in the mean time lets enjoy the holiday. Find out a handful of your classmates and at least one teacher are supernatural creatures trying to pass off as human? Well since you know their secret, why not apply to work for their government so they don't wipe your memory MIB style? Get sent back in time because a the rightful heir to the throne eloped with a shepherdess and now an ambitious warlock needs a replacement? Why not, just make sure no one outside your circle find out that you're not a man. Now what made Beauty and the Beast great was the world, the story, and the character development and relationships, but it was played very straight with no stupid humor. MBRC on the other hand was all satire and had plenty of stupid humor, but had very few serious moments. KAHK take all the best elements of these two books, a beautiful world and great character development from BB, and a ridiculous scenario and silly jokes from MBRC, and combined them flawlessly into an entertaining story of a young women trying to become King Arthur. Now of course the book has some flaws, but I don't care about them, so five stars from me.

Ugghh. I admit I only got through the first part (I guess it was the first book) of this trilogy. Great premise - I love Arthurian books. But so poorly constructed...especially the characters and their interactions. I guess as I get older my tolerance and patience are diminishing. I don't want to read about two-toned cardboard cutouts (or Barbie and Ken dolls) in a world and a plot with gaping holes and glaring inconsistencies. I won't waste my time.

With all the King Arthur has been credited for accomplishing, it only makes sense that he was really a woman from the 20/21st century. This is a set of books with great characters, plot, and faithfulness to the original legends, but perceived through a new lense. I eagerly await more installments.

While I love Shea's timeless fairy tales stories, this one seems to come up a bit short. Mostly I have a problem with the main heroine, who having been ripped from her present, and future and everyone she loves, she just seems happy to jump along with everything that happened to her, and is rather content to play the puppet. We never really see into the depth of the conflict going on with her, and some of the other characters are rather dull and one-dimensional. Its a great idea for the re-telling of King Arthur, but I feel that it is lacking a bit in emotional depth and character development

The first book I read by this author was Princess Ahira. After that, I went looking for more and found King Arthur and Her Knights. I loved it. Britt's character was really interesting. I liked that K.M. Shea used some actual Arthurian lore in her books. I also really enjoyed the interaction between Britt and Merlin. They were really funny and I really enjoyed reading the books. I'm glad K. M. Shea wrote them and I'm glad that I paid for the extra content. Totally worth it! I can't wait for the rest of the series.
