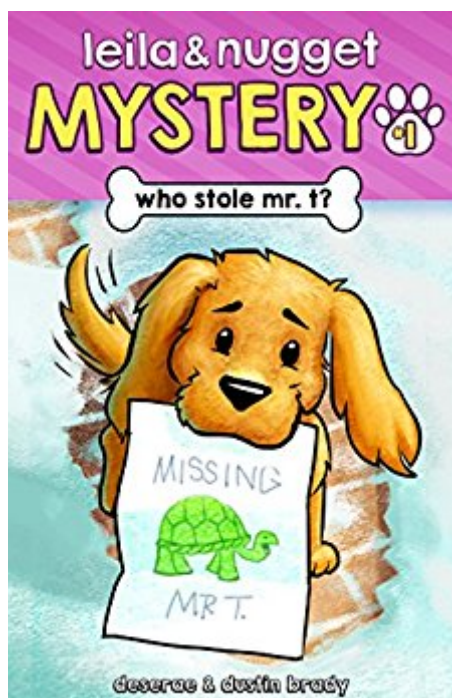


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Who Stole Mr. T? (Leila And Nugget Mystery Book 1)
